
On 28 November, we held a stakeholder engagement session for the work of the Hackney Schools Charter for Race and SEND. The charter is aimed at addressing inequalities and promoting inclusivity across our schools and settings, with a focus on anti-racism and Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. The charter recognises the importance of inequalities that



continue to negatively impact children and young people with SEND, Black Caribbean children and other groups within the Black and global majority community, therefore, at the heart of the work of the Charter is a focus on the Equalities Duty. The charter also recognises that schools may be working towards their own charters; this charter will serve to support the progression towards your school's Development Plans, ethos, values and practice in this work. Overall, the Charter aims to reflect a sustained commitment to our collective endeavours across local Hackney schools and settings by ensuring it reflects the promising practice in dismantling inequality in education amongst key groups.
